

Dermal Filler Consent

(Juvéderm Ultra XC ,™ Restylane XC®, Restylane Silk, Perlane®, Juvederm Ultra Plus XC, Voluma XC)

These dermal fillers are made of hyaluronic acid, a natural substance already found in the human body used to deliver nutrients and hydrate the skin by bonding with water. This gel is injected into facial tissue to smooth wrinkles and folds, especially around the mouth and nose.

Possible Side Effects

Most side effects are mild to moderate in nature and their duration is short, lasting seven days or less. The most common side effects include temporary injection-site reactions such as redness, pain, tenderness, discoloration, risk of infection, firmness, swelling, bruising, bleeding, lumpiness, itching and asymmetry.

Your doctor will need to know if you have any of the following:

- Allergies
- Anaphylaxis
- History of cold sores
- Recent or upcoming laser treatments of chemical peels
- History of hepatitis
- HIV or other autoimmune therapy
- Undergoing any immunosuppressive therapy

Medications to Avoid

You have been provided a list of medications and supplements to avoid two weeks prior to your dermal filler injections and understand that by not adhering to that list, you may experience mild to significant bruising at the injection sites. The list includes aspirin, Coumadin, ibuprofen and herbal supplements.

What should I expect following the procedure?

Your Physician will tell you what to expect following treatment with filler. Within the first 24hrs, you should avoid strenuous exercise, extensive sun or heat exposure and alcoholic beverages. Exposure to any of the above may cause temporary redness, swelling, and or itching at the injection sites. If there

is swelling, you may need to place an ice pack over the swollen area. You should ask your physician when makeup may be applied after your treatment.

Does the correction last forever?

No. Correction is temporary; therefore, touch-up injections as well as repeat injections are usually needed to maintain optimal correction. Less material is usually needed for repeat injections.

What other treatments are available to me?

Other treatments for dermal soft-tissue augmentation include and other hyaluronic acid based dermal fillers. Aside from these treatments, additional options for the correction of lines and wrinkles do exist; including facial creams, chemical peels and laser resurfacing treatments may be discussed with your physician.

When should you notify your Physician?

Be sure to report any redness and or visible swelling that lasts more than a few days or any other symptoms that cause you concern .
